The bible verse above it is a veiled notice to anybody who thinks they can harm others without consequences, or, it can be construed as the power of

intention, the power of spirit. The picture above is my father, Bill Bayu, me in long brown hair, and Bill's wife June, about January 1992 or December 1991.

I've made an appointment with Claytee White for this Thursday who will show me how to do oral interviews. She'll go with me on the first interview and then be with me on the second interview, and I can do my own afterwards. She'll also be preparing and sending you a bound book to be given to family members. Evidently I'm the only family member that knows about it.

As far as stories, I ran into somebody who had a story from University Medical Center (County Hospital) regarding a woman who came into the clinic with symptoms requiring intensive care. Dad recognized the symptoms when nobody else could, and then visited her every few days without charging her anything. Another is about a classmate's (of mine) husband Steve who had a condition he couldn't remedy, so he refunded Steve's money to him. How often do you hear about that? In a time when the trust level in pharmaceutical medicines is at

an all-time low, ² but higher than ever
use, the other modality of healing -
heart-to-heart - is in special need of
remembrance.
I've started a letter to you, but need
to finish it, on this topic. This is the
second letter.

Yes, I had a beautiful unforgettable
visit, thanks to you, Diana, Jerry and
everybody else. Thanks so much; I'll
never be able to repay you, but I'll
work on it.

Are there any more copies of the
book about Dr. T. E. Rhine? That's
such a chicken-soup-for-the-soul type
of book. I will endeavor to create
the stories I hear to that caliber of writing.
I appreciate the letter about Maw-
Ma dying; it was a touching one,
and I read Peggy's poem to you. It's
apparent that you both received healing
and growth from your relationship. It is
said that if you want to learn a subject
you have to teach it.
